Alert for Sacramento County Voters

The California Legislature enacted the Voters Choice Act in 2016, establishing optional pilot programs in 14 counties and full implementation in 2020. The Sacramento County Board of Supervisors agreed to launch this new method of submitting ballots in the 2018 election.

Here's what you need to know:

- All ballots will be sent to registered voters by mail
- There will no longer be voting at polling places
- The County will establish 54 ballot drop off boxes throughout the County 29 days before the Primary and General Elections
- 16 Regional Voting Centers will open 10 days prior to the Election for in person same-day voter registration and ballot submission, with an additional 61 sites open 3 days prior to Election Day
- Voters may access replacement or provisional ballots at any Voting Center
- Voting Centers will be near public transportation routes where possible, and voting machines will be available for voters with disabilities
- Anyone can drop off your ballot.
