



About the Republican Party

- **The California Republican Party (CAGOP)**, is responsible for candidate development and communications with voters and the media for the State of California. They provide trainings to grassroots workers and candidates, and have a robust election observer recruitment program. Using a targeted approach, they were responsible over the last two election cycles for flipping five Congressional seats, making the difference in the GOP taking over the House of Representatives. - **The Republican National Committee (RNC)** is primarily responsible for electing a Republican President and helping the GOP take the lead in the House and U.S. Senate. They provide states with valuable data on voters, including voter propensity and contact information. California is represented on the Committee by CAGOP Chair Jessica Patterson, National Committeewoman Harmeet Dhillon, and National Committeeman Shawn Steel. - **County Central Committees.** Every county has an elected Republican Central Committee that is responsible for recruiting and endorsing candidates, registering voters, and turning out the vote for Republican candidates at the local, state and federal levels. - **The CA Assembly & Senate Republican Caucuses** are led by Assembly James Gallagher and Senator Brian Jones. Even though they are in the minority in California's Legislature, they have been instrumental in defeating onerous legislation, and have successfully passed bills that address some of California's most pressing issues, including penalties for child abuse and holding the Newsom administration accountable for spending on homeless programs. Republicans are just one vote short of a majority in the Senate and have a good chance of taking over in the November election. Electing a Republican President and Vice President will also help as the Vice President can be a tie breaker.
